



SUBSEQUENT POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION OUTCOMES FOR 2023-2024 GRADUATES

This report presents information on the number and percentage of 2023-2024 George Mason University graduates who enrolled in or completed a subsequent postsecondary educational program after graduation from George Mason by March 2025. This report includes all degree-seeking undergraduate and graduate students, excluding Law and George Mason Korea students.

Data are derived from the National Student Clearinghouse. For students who enrolled in multiple semesters at postsecondary institutions after graduation from George Mason, their first semester of enrollment is used for summary data in this report.

I. OVERALL SUBSEQUENT POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION OUTCOMES

Approximately 21 percent of all graduates of undergraduate-level programs (n=5,849) at George Mason subsequently enrolled in another postsecondary education program following graduation. An additional two percent of graduates enrolled in and completed a subsequent postsecondary education program by March 2025.

Approximately 8 percent of all graduates of graduate-level programs at George Mason (n=4,109) subsequently enrolled in another postsecondary education program following graduation. An additional 2.5 percent of graduates enrolled in and completed a subsequent postsecondary education program by March 2025.
